Once Saved Always Saved- The Hyper-Grace Message

Is there a change between the Old Testament and the New Testament? Is this even possible?

(Mal 3:6) For I am the LORD, I change not; therefore ye sons of Jacob are not consumed.

If God changed this verse says we would be consumed. Furthermore, let us continue on with a verse in the Bible that says we are not under the law but under grace. We have several but is this what the Bible is really saying: let's look at these verses.

(Rom 4:16) Therefore *it is* of faith, that *it might be* by grace; to the end the promise might be sure to all the seed; not to that only which is of the law, but to that also which is of the faith of Abraham; who is the father of us all,

(Rom 6:14) For sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace.

(Rom 6:15) What then? shall we sin, because we are not under the law, but under grace? God forbid.

(Gal 2:21) I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness *come* by the law, then Christ is dead in vain.

When was the change to grace made then? Perhaps when Jesus was born or maybe when he returned from the grave. Did things change when the last book of the Old Testament was penned, and was that Malachi or Maccabees? Looking at Romans 4:16 was there no faith in the Old Testament.

(Hab 2:4) Behold, his soul *which* is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by his faith.

Grace is mentioned 39 times in the Old Testament and 131 times in the New Testament. What about mercy? Mercy is found in the King James OT 217 times and 59 times in the NT. Does this conclude there is no grace or mercy in the Old Testament; no but rather grace and mercy is found a lot in the OT. What about calling upon the name of the LORD in the Old Testament?

(Joe 2:32) And it shall come to pass, *that* whosoever shall call on the name of the LORD shall be delivered: for in mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the LORD hath said, and in the remnant whom the LORD shall call.

Acts 2 repeats this verse and what about Romans 10:9 and 10:13. My ears aren't being tickled by a strong argument for grace only in the New Testament. So lets say we call upon the LORD like the Bible speaks of; then what?

(2Ti 2:19) Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, The Lord knoweth them that are his. And, Let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity.

Should we go on sinning?

(Rom 6:15) What then? shall we sin, because we are not under the law, but under grace? God forbid.

If grace were a license to sin then what do we do with the following verse?

(Jud 1:4) For there are certain men crept in unawares, who were before of old ordained to this condemnation, ungodly men, turning the grace of our God into lasciviousness, and denying the only Lord God, and our Lord Jesus Christ.

If grace were free then why does the Bible mention works with it?

(Eph 2:8) For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: *it is* the gift of God:

(Eph 2:9) Not of works, lest any man should boast.

(Eph 2:10) For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

(Tit 3:5) Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost;

(Tit 3:6) Which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour;

(Tit 3:7) That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

(Tit 3:8) *This is* a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable unto men.

I've never seen a salvation card with Ephesians 2:10 on it and why; because there is an agenda. If we push hyper-grace, we can entertain folks and could that lead to more tithes? I will answer that question myself. I have a strong online presence with my sites but I get no where because I preach truth that a person is not easily saved. I have received zero donations over a period of almost 13 years of being in the world wide web. No one likes the sites, no comments, no forwarding or anything else. (1Pe 4:18) And if the righteous scarcely be saved, where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear?

We will appear in hell or a complete blotting out of existence that Jeremiah calls a perpetual sleep.

(Jer 51:39) In their heat I will make their feasts, and I will make them drunken, that they may rejoice, and sleep a perpetual sleep, and not wake, saith the LORD.

(Jer 51:57) And I will make drunk her princes, and her wise *men*, her captains, and her rulers, and her mighty men: and they shall sleep a perpetual sleep, and not wake, saith the King, whose name *is* the LORD of hosts.

Am I a liar because I say heaven is a narrow road and that both hell and death exist? Paul must be because my next quotes are from him.

(Gal 6:7) Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.

(2Co 9:6) But this *I say*, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully.

Is it possible to lose your salvation? I think so and so did the Apostle Paul.

(Heb 6:4) For *it is* impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost,

(Heb 6:5) And have tasted the good word of God, and the powers of the world to come,

(Heb 6:6) If they shall fall away, to renew them again unto repentance; seeing they crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put *him* to an open shame.

(Heb 6:7) For the earth which drinketh in the rain that cometh oft upon it, and bringeth forth herbs meet for them by whom it is dressed, receiveth blessing from God:

(Heb 6:8) But that which beareth thorns and briers *is* rejected, and *is* nigh unto cursing; whose end *is* to be burned.

(Heb 10:26) For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins,

(Heb 10:27) But a certain fearful looking for of judgment and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries.

(Heb 10:28) He that despised Moses' law died without mercy under two or three witnesses:

(Heb 10:29) Of how much sorer punishment, suppose ye, shall he be thought worthy, who hath trodden under foot the Son of God, and hath counted the blood of the covenant, wherewith he was sanctified, an unholy thing, and hath done despite unto the Spirit of grace?

(Heb 10:30) For we know him that hath said, Vengeance *belongeth* unto me, I will recompense, saith the Lord. And again, The Lord shall judge his people.

(Heb 10:31) *It is* a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.

These above verses are self-explanatory.

(1Co 6:9) Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind,

(1Co 6:10) Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God.

(1Co 6:11) And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God.

(Rev 21:7) He that overcometh shall inherit all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son.

(Rev 21:8) But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death.

These words in red were straight out of Jesus mouth. Maybe he is a liar too? Does Satan believe in God. Oh Yeah! Will he be saved so we can have Satan in heaven with us? Maybe we need to do what Bill Johnson and blot out the Old Testament outside of Songs of Solomon, Psalms and Proverbs. We need to wash the Bible clean.
